One tool I'd like to share is the webpage we created for the Eastern Sierra Recreation Collaborative (ESRC). We recognized early on that there was going to be a need for sharing lots of information in a timely and streamlined manner, so we set-up an ESRC webpage as part of the MLTPA website (MLTPA was the NFF grant recipient so we utilized their portal).

The ESRC webpage served a few different purposes:

- 1) It captured contact information for parties interested in participating in ESRC (they were added to the distribution list)
- 2) It established an archive library for foundational documents used by ESRC
- 3) It created a timeline of information developed at each of the gateway community meetings
- 4) It served as the information source for new participants to review in order to quickly get up to speed with earlier work
- 5) It served as the calendar for noticing upcoming deadlines and meeting notices

What made this an effective tool?

- 1) Information was updated and posted in a timely manner
- 2) Information was organized in easy-to-access manner and able to find in one place
- 3) Photo images posted captured participation and showed work
- 4) It was a reliable source for pre/post information sharing.
