Thanks to you, we planted 2.6 million trees in 2018.

What is the impact of 2.6 million trees?

- More than **10,000 football fields** of restored forest
- Thousands of acres of **revived habitat for threatened and endangered species across the country**, including the red cockaded woodpecker, grizzly bear, Kirtland's warbler and Canada lynx
- Dozens of watersheds rejuvenated, reducing erosion and **filtering drinking water for millions**
- Millions of metric tons of carbon dioxide sequestered, **buffering the effects of global climate change.**

- 25 National Forests planted in 2018
- 13,000 acres restored
- 2.6 million trees planted
- 17 different native tree species
