

50 MILLION FOR OUR FORESTS

2021 Impact Report

Each year, we strive to further our reforestation impact on public National Forests. In 2021, we did just that, planting more than **7,338,912 trees** on National Forests across the country—our most yet!

Prior to launching our 50 Million campaign in 2018, the NFF planted more than 9.5 million trees. After starting the campaign, we started a new count. Today, **50 Million For Our Forests** has planted more than 20 million trees, with commitments to plant millions more in 2022. We will continue to raise funds for the campaign through Earth Day 2023 and aim to have all projects completed by the end of 2025.

This is more than a tree planting campaign. It is a commitment to restoring U.S. public lands that provide so much to all of us—clean drinking water, fresh air, a future for our children, and places to go play.

Over the lifetime of the trees planted in 2021, they can sequester a whopping 3.6 million Metric tons CO₂e.

That is equivalent to removing the CO₂ emissions released from approximately 6.5 million passengers flying roundtrip from Los Angeles to New York City.*




*Metric tons CO₂e based on the average sequestered per tree over 100 years; ICAO carbon emissions calculator (passengers) based on fuel consumption data.



National Forest Reforestation

Wildfire now makes up 80 percent of the reforestation need on National Forests. More than half of our campaign projects in 2021 supported post-fire recovery. Our projects also planted following insect and disease outbreaks, such as planting for spruce beetle recovery in Colorado, and for native habitat restoration, including expanding native longleaf pine habitat in the Southeast. No matter the objective, all projects can improve wildlife habitat, carbon storage, and soil, air, and water quality.


