## Seedball Making Event and Nectar Corridor Planting

The **Forest Service, APS, and National Forest Foundation** are hosting a volunteer event to make and disperse pollinator-friendly seed balls along powerline corridors near Wet Beaver Creek in the Verde Valley. The seed mix has been specially developed based on native, locally adapted flowers that provide nectar and host plants for pollinators including monarch butterflies.

**When?** November 7, 2021 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM

**Why?** Many pollinator populations are at risk because of habitat loss, invasive species, and pesticides. In fact, the Monarch butterfly is on the verge of being placed on the endangered species list. Power transmission lines are potential habitat for the pollinator we rely on.
